

MOTION

Historic-Cultural Monuments are designated by the Cultural Heritage Commission and confirmed by the Council to acknowledge noteworthy architecture or structures and sites associated with historic events or personages.

In January 2004, the Council instructed the Cultural Affairs Department to work with the Cultural Heritage Commission and the City Attorney to amend the relevant Ordinance to require applicants for Historic-Cultural Monuments to install plaques that identify the year of completion as well as the names of professional architects, engineers, and contractors responsible for the Historic-Cultural Monuments' design and construction.


There are over 700 Historic-Cultural Monuments throughout the City, which are identified with plaques or signage. In some instances, the Department of Transportation installs street signs in the public-right-of way to identify a Historic-Cultural Monument. In order for the Department of Transportation to install the street signs, the Council must authorize the installation of the signs.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council instruct the Department of Transportation to install permanent ceremonial street signs identifying the locations of the following two Historic-Cultural Monuments:

1. *Monterrey Trailer Park* (6411 Monterrey Road): Historic-Cultural Monument No. 736.
2. *Hotel Residence and Tea House* (6508, 6512, and 6516 N. Monterrey Road) and (6511, 6515, 6519 N. Short Way): Historical-Cultural Monument No.802.

I FURTHER MOVE that the Council instruct the Department of Transportation to prepare a report within 30 days on the funding process for permanent ceremonial street signs.
