Dear Annette Delamora:

The Glassell Park Post Office serves several communities in the Northeast area of Los Angeles, including those where stakeholders of the Arroyo Seco Neighborhood Council live and work. Our stakeholders have long been complaining that the parking lot at this Post Office is woefully inadequate considering the number of households served, and that the single driveway serving as access and egress to this parking lot is very difficult and dangerous, due to the limited visibility to and heavy traffic on Eagle Rock Boulevard.

In the past year numerous remote letter drop boxes have been removed from the intersections in our communities, thus more and more customers have need to go the post office location to mail their letters and bills. These trips added to the other business conducted at the post office have compounded the traffic and parking situation at the Glassell Park Post Office.

On Behalf of our stakeholders and the other residents served by the Glassell Park Post Office, we are requesting that the Post Office consider remedies to these situations, such as leasing additional land to provide added parking spaces and additional driveways, possibly on the adjacent parcel at the corner of Ave 40 and Eagle Rock Boulevard. Also, we are asking you to look into traffic flow has been improved at the Atwater Village Post Office at 3370 Glendale Boulevard with expanded parking and access.
