

Proposed Community Impact Statements for May 2017

- a. Council File 17-0002-S51 - H.R. 2073 (Velasquez) / Immigration and Nationality Act / Clothing Resolution dated 4/25/17

The ASNC urges the adoption of this resolution supporting the amendment of Section 2073 of the Immigration and Nationality Act to prohibit immigration officers or agents of Homeland Security for wearing clothing or other items bearing the word “police” and agrees that this practice, if continued, fuels fear, undermines trust, and further marginalizes immigrant residents of Los Angeles.

- b. Council File 17-0538 - Preserving Safety Next to Active Hillside Construction Sites Motion dated 5/12/17

The ASNC supports the motion to clarify the enforcement roles of multiple city departments in restricting parking, traffic, deliveries, etc in and around construction sites to better protect the public safety in hillside areas with steep, narrow or substandard streets.

- c. CIS addressed to BONC regarding the Proposed Hermon Subdivision

The Arroyo Seco Neighborhood Council (ASNC) does not agree with the boundary changes proposed by the new Hermon Neighborhood Council. The boundaries agreed to and accepted by the Hermon community for over 13 years must remain. ASNC stakeholders should not be adversely affected by any changes inherent in the new Hermon NC.

- d. Council File 17-0600 – Neighborhood Council Elections

The Los Angeles Neighborhood Council (LANCC) and Arroyo Seco Neighborhood Council (ASNC) supports that the City Clerk and DONE conduct the 2018 elections as scheduled. Board members elected in 2018 would have a three year term. This would allow the City Clerk to conduct Neighborhood Council elections in odd number years. The Los Angeles Neighborhood Council (LANCC) and Arroyo Seco Neighborhood Council (ASNC) supports that the City Council and Council President Herb Wesson authorize the rollover of the FY 2016-2017 funds to FY 2017-2018 to be used for the expressed purpose of Neighborhood Council elections and outreach. The additional funding will allow Neighborhood Councils to promote civic engagement and empowerment for its stakeholders.
