**M I N U T E S – Final / Approved Jan. 13, 2015**

The Hermon Local Issues (LI) committee meeting was called to order at 7:12 by the chair. Including one City representative (LAPD), a total of 43 individuals attended at least some part of the meeting, with 38 acknowledging ASNC/Hermon stakeholder status. Under ASNC Standing Rules -- quorum requirements were satisfied.

**Orlean Keller** moved to approve the September Hermon LI “special” meeting minutes as provided; **Cliff Moseley** and others seconded. The chair explained the impact of the latest advice from the Office of the L.A. City Attorney regarding recording vote counts for NC committees. After brief discussion, the question was called and a raised-hand vote count tallied 27/0/2 (yes/no/abstain), respectively. Motion passed. (Of those 29 votes cast, 27 stakeholder/committee members were willing to have their votes recorded, by name – as follows):

Hermon veterans **John Ullman** (USN), **AJ Jaramillo** (USN), **TJ Gonzalez** (USA), **Cliff Moseley** (USN), and **Douglas Sakamoto** (USA), self-identified for military service and were thanked by the audience on Veterans Day 2014.

Newly assigned LAPD **Sgt. Guillermo Galvan**, now in charge of all Hollenbeck Sr. Lead Officers, answered questions on behalf of Hermon-area Basic Car SLO Austin Fernald, who was ill. One stakeholder also recounted recent advice received by phone from Neighborhood Prosecutor Cynthia Gonzalez (off on City holiday) related to her duties.

Public comments were heard, as were announcements of upcoming community events, including: a business-sponsored community-wide cleanup (Nov. 15); the traditional median tree-lighting ceremony (Dec. 5), and a community organization-hosted City Council candidate forum (Jan. 13 – after Hermon Local Issues) being planned to include those qualifying for the ballot to run in District 14 next year.

Verbal reports were heard from both Hermon public schools (**Lupe Rosas**, **Cliff Moseley**) – with each making informal requests for stakeholder support in the coming weeks. Due to the late hour, **Mark Legassie** gave an abbreviated report of the work of the NELA Disaster Survival Task Force, including most recent contacts with SoCal Gas. In addition, official Safety Handbooks acquired from L.A. County were handed out to all attending. Each included an insert showing corresponding L.A. City emergency contacts.

Meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.; committee will reconvene at 6:30 p.m., January 13, 2015.
