- September Minutes approved.

**Agenda Item 3: Presentations From Public Officials**

- Susie Lopez of Council District 14's (CD14) office explained that the Department of Recreation and Parks is aware of the irrigation issues in Budd Wiener Park, there is a delay due to COVID-19, but it is on the to-do list. They are looking into the no smoking signs that the community has requested, the community would prefer if the signs were re-positioned instead of adding additional signs. The shaded benches project is moving along, but has been delayed two to three months, the Councilmember is aware of the issue. Regarding the construction on Via Marisol, near Hermon Community Park, it will take place from February 2021 to August 2022, but the construction will be completed by March 2022, but they remaining time will be used for testing. Via Marisol is a major community street and they will complete the construction in phases so that the street can remain in use.
- Councilmember Kevin de Leon considered CD14 to be ground zero for the homelessness crisis as there are more homeless individuals in CD14 than in any other part of the country. We are in extraordinary times, and there will likely be a tsunami of evictions in January of 2022, and he is working to support the community.

When it comes to Budd Wiener Park the community explained that the shaded benches have not be installed, there is supposed to be a bench by the little library, the new irrigation has made the issue worse, there is a massive gopher population.

The Councilmember has always supported the zoning of open space for Parcel S and he will continue to maintain the zoning of open space. He believes it is time to get ahold of the owner and find out his motivations for investing in Parcel S.

The community also gave detailed background information on issues between Hermon and Monterey Hills, especially the fact that when Hermon separated from ASNC it left Monterey Hills isolated from the rest of the Neighborhood Council.

Monterey Hills is interested in regular street sweeping and the Councilmember will be meeting with department heads regarding this issue. There is an issue with red street curbs which are faded which can be dangerous, some locations were approved and others were denied as they were deemed not faded enough that they were still "visible." Some community members are concerned over the loss of the Monterey Hills voting center, but that is a county issue which is out of our control. Unfortunately there wasn't enough public information released regarding the new system. There also were concerns raised over the Hermon Neighborhood Council trying to change the name of Via Marisol to Hermon Rd. This change would cost a lot of money, but currently nothing is official.

- Senior Lead Officer Gus Camacho of the LAPD remorded that crime is significantly higher than last year, an increase in homicide by 57%, an 8% rise in burglaries, and a 50% increase in stolen vehicles. There was a gang related shooting last month by Avenue 60 and the 110, the suspect is in custody, but the community raised complaints over a shrine in the area. SLO Camacho has been spending time on Via Colina during the day. The relaxed parking laws have been addressed and vehicles can be moved if they are not used for dwelling purposes.
