**8. COMMUNITY IMPACT STATEMENTS** *Full text of of CIS and Council File in board packet*

Motion to approve opposition to **CF 21-0182 "Olivia Mitchell Youth Council."** Due to budget and staffing cuts imposed upon the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) and resulting lack of support provided to the Neighborhood Council system that it is mandated by the City Charter to provide, the Arroyo Seco Neighborhood Council (ASNC) opposes establishing a Youth Council under the jurisdiction of DONE. If the City Council wishes to establish a Youth Council, then the City Council should provide their own funding and staffing to support the Youth Council or a separate city department and to sufficiently fund such a department. Further, the ASNC demands that LA City Council eliminate gender binary language associated with the Youth Council, irrespective of which party is responsible for it.
- b. Motion to approve opposition to **CF 21-0407 Standardize Election Rules:** To Arts, Parks, Health, Education, and Neighborhoods Committee Motion (Rodriguez - Cedillo) relative to instructing the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment to report with a survey of Neighborhood Council election rules; and request the City Attorney to report on the City Council's authority to standardize election rules. The Arroyo Seco Neighborhood Council OPPOSES CF21-0407 as an attack on the independence of Neighborhood Councils and their ability to self-govern as defined in the City Charter.
