TREE PLANTING IN DEBS PARK** Long time Debs Park supporter/Montecito Heights resident Thomas Berg seeks support for a tree planting in the south end of Debs Park near where the murdered girls were found. This supplements trees planted 20 years ago in a public event with a mariachi band and refreshments. Irrigation already in place. The Debs Park Advisory Board has endorsed the idea. Audubon Center will contribute plant material. Assemblymember Jimmie Gomez will also donate. NPG/CIP budget not yet determined.
- 6. AMP/Josh Buck NPG** of \$1500 for youth activities. Date, location and ASNC's role to be determined.
- 7. DOG WALK EVENT** Request up to \$1000 for spring parade event for dogs at Budd Weiner Park. Determine date and details.
