b. Update on City Council's Homeless Encampment Ban Ordinance.

Info:

CF 20-1376-S1 Ordinance 41.18

No encampments can impede right of way as per the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990

10 feet within a usable driveway

5 feet from any building entrance/exit

2 feet from any fire hydrant

Not in streets or in bike lanes

500 feet from a property of sensitive use, including School, Day Care Center, Public Park, or Public

Library

500 feet from a designated overpass, underpass, freeway ramp, tunnel, bridge, pedestrian bridge, subway, wash, spreading ground, or active railway

1000 feet from any shelter/safe parking opened after Jan 1, 2018

Anywhere that there is a sign saying you can't sit/lie/sleep, etc.

The council has to put up a sign with a date to clear. 14 calendar days

have passed from the date on which the signage is posted at the designated area or areas.

If they don't move, they would be cited in accordance to Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 11.0

July 21, 2021- Los Angeles Homelessness Services Authority Releases 2021 Housing Inventory Count And Shelter Count Results

The Los Angeles region needs to build a more balanced system with more housing options. A balanced rehousing system has five permanent housing exits for each shelter bed; the Los Angeles system is closer to 1 to 1, leading to people experiencing homelessness becoming stuck in shelter and on the streets. The shortage of affordable housing options in LA is the result of decades of intentional policy choices to downzone housing capacity and exclude and marginalize people of color. As a result, Los Angeles now has the fewest number of housing units per adult of any major American city.

“It is critical that our region continues to add to our housing and shelter supply. We need more strategic investments that create low-barrier and private shelter options in areas of the county where the need is greatest,” continued Marston. “But shelter without a permanent housing option leaves people stuck. Critical to this equation is ensuring housing on the other side. LA County also needs 509,000 affordable housing units to meet the current need, and the housing market is saturated with a 5% vacancy rate. Thanks to Prop. HHH, there are nearly 13,000 permanent housing units on the way, but we need more affordable housing options to solve our region’s housing crisis.”
